## **ALDBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL**

Next meeting on **Wednesday 1st December** at **7.30** in the Community Centre.

Items from the minutes of the November minutes (Editor's choice):

### **Matters Arising**

**The lower part of the Green** is too wet to cut.

A new **cradle seat for the swing** is ready for fixing.

Town and Parish Councils' **freedom to set their own precepts** will not be restricted by the proposed legislation – ascertained.

NNDC had approved the **request to change the name of the parish**; PW had spoken in support.

**Bulbs had been planted** around the village sign. NCC were unable to support a request for **traffic calming measures in Margaret Lilly Way** – no funds and no recorded accidents; a Community Speed Watch could be established.

Pegg Electrical will carry out the **safety checks for the electricity supply box** on the Green and for the Christmas Tree lights, free of charge.

The **Cricket Club** wished to submit a quotation for **grass cutting on the Green** in 2011; all quotations received would be brought to the next meeting.

**Wayleave Agreements with EDF Energy** include the poles and overhead cables on the Green.

The "hidden" **30 mph sign in Chapel Lane** – NCC cannot relocate it without an amendment to the Road Traffic Order; they will deal with the overhanging hedge once the owner is identified.

**BM** had now put the second junior goal post on The Green but had been unable to repair the other one.

**The Parish Council** agreed with his proposal to purchase another one.

*The meeting was here suspended to allow a member of the public present to speak. Mr Dennis Bacon drew attention to the remains of some old goal posts on the Green. JP had already made a request for their removal. Mr Bacon also commented on the grass cuttings left on the verge in Thurgarton Road.*

### **Police Community Support Officer's Report**

Since the last meeting, one crime had been reported and there were five calls to the police.

### **Letter from Aldborough Cricket Club**

The Cricket Club are seeking support for the placing of a mobile changing unit on the Green near the Red Lion and the provision of a practice net in the area near the basketball court. The Parish Council are sympathetic towards the dilemma faced by the Club, but agree that more information needs to be provided. Representatives of the Club are to be invited to the next meeting to make a presentation on their proposals, to include an indication of the visual impact of such a unit as well as the reactions of residents around the Green, especially those living near the Red Lion.

**'Risk Assessment - November 2010'** was approved.

A copy would now be forwarded to NNDC, re the siting of the Christmas Tree.

### **Reports by Parish Councillors**

**HT – Recycling Banks** – The bottle bank is being emptied regularly.

**SP – Play Areas** – NCC have received a revised allocation for the Playbuilder 2 Programme, and their Cabinet are expected to consider it shortly. If a grant is forthcoming, the work will have to be completed by 31st March 2011.

**TB – Community Centre** – The improvements to the toilet accommodation should be completed by 3rd December.

**JH – Footpaths** – They are in "wet order".

**BM – Planning** – Consent has been given for the demolition of a greenhouse at Greystones, Thurgarton Road, Aldborough.

No objections were raised to a planning application for the erection of a replacement single-storey rear extension at Fernleigh, The Green, Aldborough.

Concerns were raised about potential traffic implications of a planning application for the construction of a biomass fuelled renewable energy facility at Stonepit Hill, Plum Lane, Gresham. The Clerk will submit the Parish Council's response, after further discussions between JP and BM.

**BM** has heard that the Local Development Framework proposals will proceed after the Inspector's report is received, now expected in December 2010. The regional targets, e.g. for housing, will almost certainly be revised.

**BM – History Society** – Work on the new book is progressing well and copies should be on sale in the New Year.

### **Financial Matters**

The Parish Council considered possible donations and decided to give £450 to Aldborough Parochial Church Council for maintenance of the graveyard, and £100 to East Anglian Air Ambulance, under their Section 137 powers.

### **NEWS from ALDBOROUGH SURGERY**

The long awaited extension and refurbishment will be starting in January 2011. The new extension will consist of a larger, improved waiting and reception area, office facilities, a new treatment and consultation room with additional toilet and baby change facilities. Upstairs will be extended to provide training facilities for medical students and GP Registrars. The existing building will undergo extensive refurbishment, the dispensary area will be enlarged and have its own smaller waiting area. The treatment room and consultation rooms will be completely refurbished, enabling the surgery to comply with current infection control and other regulations, which have changed since the surgery was built only 16 years ago.

In order for this work to be undertaken, **car parking** facilities will not be available immediately after the New Year. There will be **three disabled parking spaces, with no other parking allowed**, due to Health & Safety Regulations. Parking has been made available for patients at the **rear of the Community Centre**, thanks to the Community Centre Committee, and at **the allotment car park** for the overflow and staff parking, by kind permission of Mr Hammond.

The first stage of the build will be the extension to the rear of the existing property, followed by the refurbishment of the current building. This will, of course, cause slight problems with room allocation, clinical times, lack of dispensary storage and turnaround times. We aim to keep the disruption to a minimum and ask that you bear with us during this time. We will endeavour to provide regular updates for patients.

We extend a warm invitation to everyone, to join us at Erpingham Village Hall for the switching on of the Christmas tree lights outside the Village Hall, followed by singing some traditional Carols in the Hall and enjoying some seasonal nibbles together.

## **ERPINGHAM with CALTHORPE PLAY AREA**

If you use the play area you will have noticed that the crossbar on the seesaw had broken, and the rubber on the cradle swing seats was perishing. You'll now see brand-new replacements for these which we hope will last a while. Much of the equipment is reaching the stage where it will need replacing and we need to raise funds to do this. It is a very good play area, used by many people, and we need to keep it in good condition. Any donations, or offers to raise funds, will be great. There is also a new gate. The old gate to the path had been deliberately smashed and destroyed, we think on the night of Saturday 30th October when there were quite a few young people making a noise and running about there. Can I appeal firstly to the young people of the villages to continue to look after the play area as you have for the past six years, and, secondly, to all parents to be sure that your older children are not involved in this selfish behaviour. ## **ERPINGHAM with CALTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL**

### **Report of the November meeting (Editor's choice)**

Faith Davies (North Norfolk District Council) gave the Council an up-to-date position on **the Exception Housing scheme** and how this may affect Erpingham and Calthorpe. She explained the current housing needs in the district and that 36 applicants sought to live in Erpingham or surrounding villages. A small 'exception' scheme in Erpingham was being considered and a village meeting was suggested; funding constraints may delay progress. The meeting discussed the criteria for letting social housing.

**Matters arising.** The Clerk read the Norfolk County Council reply about current **highways** items; the potholes had been scheduled for repair and NCC had written to a householder about barriers on the footway. The Clerk had had a site meeting with the new Highways Engineer for the parish. On a **village sign** the Chairman suggested that this project could be tied to the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and asked that the item go on the next agenda. R Daniels was now in touch with a view to representing of the Council on the **governing body of Erpingham Primary School**. On the **twinning proposal** a response to the letter to Azincourt's mayor is awaited. The Clerk confirmed that he had submitted a parish response to the North Norfolk District Council Housing Strategy.

**Planning.** Consent had been given to the conversion to a residential building at Erpingham House but the application for an extension and detached dwelling at 1 Jubilee Close had been refused.

**Finance.** the Council reviewed the current year budget (2010-11) and first draft budget for next year (-12) and decided to set a **precept of £6125 for 2011-12**. Payments due were approved for grass cutting, Chairman's mileage and the Information Commissioners' renewal fee.

**Review of the "Welcome Leaflet"**. The Chairman would talk to its originator and pass copies to members for comment; the Council would consider including advertisements to offset printing costs.

**The Clerk's report** advised that during an 'open day' visit for clerks to NCC's Aylsham depot he had learned that Erpingham and Calthorpe highways needs would in future be serviced from Caister depot. The manager at Caister assured him that their intention was to make the change seamless. He had referred the dumped waste by the church to NNDistrict Council and this had been removed.

**Members reports.** The 'High Noon Road' sign had been damaged; the No 50 bus service had been withdrawn and the Chairman had attended the AGM of the County Association. The glass in the notice board at the Spreadeagle PH had been replaced but had been broken again; costs would be obtained for an alternative.

**Open session.** There would be an illuminated Christmas tree outside the village hall this year.

**Used Stamps.** At this time of year we all get some stamps on our post. I collect them for two charities, the RNIB and the IA (Ileostomy Association). If you are able to help, please leave stamps in my door, or at the Community Centre on Tuesdays (lunch time or evening). Val Barnes

**Trading Standards Top Ten Tips for Christmas Shopping**

**Did you know** you have no automatic right to a refund if you just change your mind? Or that you may have more rights when you buy from a catalogue than a shop? If we all know our rights we can make better decisions and avoid some of the pitfalls of Christmas shopping.

**Unwanted presents** Shops don't have to take things back unless there's something wrong with them but often help out of goodwill. Check before you buy and ask if they do gift receipts.

**Receipts** Proof of purchase is very important if you do need to return anything. Put receipts in a safe place as soon as you start shopping.

**Check it out** Check presents before you wrap them. This avoids upsets on Christmas Day and helps you sort things out quickly with shops if there's a problem.

**Credit** Think about paying by credit card for goods over £100. You may get extra protection if things go wrong, but make sure you know the full cost and can afford the repayments.

**Debt** Don't let money problems pile up. You can check where to get free impartial advice at [www.norfolk.gov.uk/managingyourfinances](http://www.norfolk.gov.uk/managingyourfinances). We've created a booklet '**Looking to the future**' which highlights some of the support available locally. Download it from the site or call **0344 800 8020**.

**Christmas shops** Be very careful with "Christmas shops" and one-day sales that appear overnight. They often disappear just as quickly with no one left to complain to if things go wrong.

**Delivery** If you're ordering presents, get written confirmation that they'll be delivered in time. If you don't, you might get an estimated delivery date only and have to accept goods after Christmas.

**Buying from home** You have the right to change your mind with most things bought on line or by mail order. If you're buying over the internet, you also get protection against fraud if you pay by credit or debit card.

**Fakes** Watch out for cheap fakes as they're likely to be poor quality and could be unsafe. Common ones at Christmas are designer clothes, watches and perfume.

**Toys** Stick to age warnings on toys and look for safety signs like the Lion mark. Make sure younger children don't get hold of toys made for older ones and check for loose parts or sharp points.

**ALDBOROUGH HISTORY SOCIETY**

\*\*\*\*\***COMPETITION**\*\*\*\*\*

As you may be aware, the Society is currently researching and writing its next book. This time we are concentrating on some of the older houses in both Aldborough and Thurgarton. The more we studied them, the more we discovered the homes had really interesting people associated with each one, so we have now written about both the structures of the houses, and their owners and inhabitants.

Now this is where you come in! We need a **TITLE** for our book. It can't be too long, as it has to fit on the cover. It obviously needs to reflect the content of the book, but otherwise the choice is yours!
