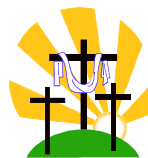

## ALDBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL

*Items from the minutes of the February meeting –Editor’s choice*

- The **refurbishment of the village sign** was now complete and ready for re-installation but the base needs some repair work. It was proposed that an application be made to the Holt Partnership for a grant towards the costs. Wayland Prison cannot make a charge for the refurbishment, so a donation of £200 to Quidenham Hospice was proposed. Once the sign is back in place there should be a re-dedication with some small appreciation gifts.
- Police Community Support Officer Simon Berrisford stated that **no crimes had been reported** since 3rd December 07.
- **The Youth Club** is now up and running, with 8 attending the first meeting. 3 computers with software are now available and ideas have been submitted for future activities.
- Mr John Hammond had attended the Holt Partnership Meeting in December and intends to make **grant applications for re-surfacing the Church Room access road and repairing the base of the village sign.** Julie Suter (NNDC) is meeting him about the applications.
- **Planning applications:** Meadow View, The Green, single storey rear extension approved.  
The Haven, Thwaite Hill, erection of single-storey rear extension/conservatory, sunroom, front porch and conversion of garage to annexe approved subject to condition restricting the annexe from use as a separate dwellinghouse.  
I Dunno, Thwaite Hill, – erection of first floor rear extension refused.  
5 Old School Cottages, Thwaite Road, – erection of replacement garage – no objections.
- Complaints has been received about **dog fouling on the Green and in the village.**
- District Councillor Peter Willcox had received confirmation that there is a long waiting list for automatic speed surveys, which cost £600.00 each. Agreed that the Clerk would write to request formal inclusion on the list. He handed over 20 **smoke alarms**, some explanatory leaflets and a form that needs completing for each installation. (If further information about these is needed, ask Tony Baillie.)

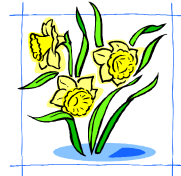

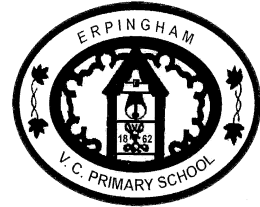

# News from Erpingham School



Praises galore reigned down on Erpingham VC Primary School, one of the smallest schools in Norfolk, with only 20 children on roll, as it underwent an inspection by OFSTED. Chair of Governors, Father Brian Faulkner, said, "We are delighted that the good quality of our school has been seen for what it is as we look forward to the future."

Rigorous discussions and intense evidence-gathering resulted in the school being judged 'a Good School' with some outstanding features. The quality of the curriculum and pupils' personal development were both judged outstanding – a remarkable accomplishment for such a small school and a positive endorsement of Norfolk County Council's commitment to offering a diverse range of Educational Provision within the County.

"We are absolutely delighted," smiled Headteacher Deborah Leahy proudly. "We have a very happy and successful school here where each child is taught to individual needs. It is wonderful to have our commitment and achievements endorsed and dedication to each child recognised."

The Report states that 'Pastoral care is exemplary,' 'Academic Guidance is excellent,' and that 'staff share an exceptionally strong commitment to children's enjoyment and achievement.' Further comments show that 'teachers are highly skilled at planning learning through links between subjects,' and 'they successfully balance challenge with support.'

"We love coming to school," stated Eden Callingham, Chairperson of the School Council, "School is always fun, even when you have to work really hard."

Naturally the Report has identified a couple of areas for development - the school has already implemented strategies to rectify these.

"This is such a unique little school," smiled parent Jolander Ayling, "I am so proud that my children come here." What more can we say – well done Erpingham!! The school will be holding an informal celebration on Thursday 21st February at 2pm – please contact the school office if you wish to attend: everyone will be very welcome.
