

ALDBOROUGH AND THURGARTON PARISH COUNCIL

From the minutes of the meeting on 2nd April (Editor's choice)

Police Community Support Officer Simon Berrisford was welcomed. 12 calls were made to the police from the Parish since the beginning of February.

Matters arising: The bottle banks have been emptied. The roundabout is painted. The Cricket Club have decided that their portable nets will not remain on the Green after use but will be removed and stored elsewhere.

Highways have confirmed the replacement of road signs: there may be a delay if some need to be ordered.

An alder tree has been planted by Rochelle Mortimer Massingham at the bottom of the Green in memorial to Ida Impson. A small plaque is to be erected at the base of the tree.

North Norfolk District Council advise that the entire length of Chapel Road is in Aldborough, not Thurgarton. Clerk to write requesting a detailed map to show the division of the two settlements, with a copy of the letter to Cllr Peter Willcox.

Football and Cricket Congratulations to Aldborough Lions who have been promoted. They are not happy with the drainage problems on the Green: the possibility of grants for works is being examined.

Planning The appeal for the certificate of lawful use for the caravan at Aldborough Hall has been withdrawn. A planning application for the caravan has been submitted.

48 Margaret Lilly Way – planning permission granted.

Studio, Kent's' Loke, The Green – planning permission granted with conditions.

Bridge Farm, Thurgarton – planning permission granted.

6 Thwaite Hill Cottages – erection of summerhouse, no objections.

Water Board radio mast, Thurgarton Hall Road, Thurgarton – no objections.

John Brown's House – Solar panel to rear single storey roof – no objections.

Benches on the Green A new bench is in place on the play area, provided by Mrs C Seed.

Allotments The end of year report was presented. The allotments are in their third year and enthusiasm remains high.

They are to be open this year as part of the Open Garden Scheme in June, in aid of the Red Cross.

Play area The old bench is being restored and will be repositioned on the Green near the Post Office.

ALDBOROUGH PRIMARY SCHOOL

Aldborough Primary School is preparing to have a wildlife pond. The School has been an Eco School for 6 years and currently has a Silver award, acknowledging its commitment to involving the whole school and community in environmental issues. The children, through activities of the Eco Committee, have requested a wildlife pond with a birdhide/field classroom in an area of the school grounds. They have been fantastically encouraging staff, governors and parents to help fund-raise and plan for the pond, which we now hope will begin this year. Please go and look at the plans displayed in the school foyer: they show a pond, a wildflower meadow and small woodland area, enclosed in a safety fence. A large birdhide overlooks all the area. Children and parents will be involved in creating and managing the area which sits beside a wild area already used for mini-beast excursions. The pond area will be used, supervised, at breaks and after school and especially by the Eco Club. The birdhide will have free access. Pond-dipping events for all are already planned, following on from successful moth and bat evenings and mini-beast events.

We are busy fund-raising and applying for grants, with money from the Spring Fair being donated by the Friends of Aldborough School and the children growing and selling plants at school. If you can help support this project which we are all very excited about we would love to hear from you.

News from Enpingham School

Erpingham Primary School opened its extensive grounds with new boardwalk and pond-dipping platform, to the public during the Easter Holidays. Two Outdoor Learning Days were held which were attended by families from Erpingham, Aldborough, Aylsham and surrounding village, who enjoyed exploring the area to learn about wildlife and nature, through activities organised by the school's early years teacher and outdoor learning expert, Miss Louise Ambrose.

Children enjoyed a wildlife Easter egg hunt and camouflage games, as well as investigating life in the huge school pond. They were also able to make woven birds' nests and elder-wood jewellery, while munching fruit. There was no charge for either day. Headteacher Deborah Leahy said, 'The purpose of these days is twofold. We want to encourage children to learn about the rural community in which they live, and also, we see ourselves as a community facility and welcome people to see what we do and share what we have.'

The event is part of the school's commitment to encourage respect for nature and to help children realise their obligation to look after and protect our environment. The two days also helped children to meet new friends and work and learn together. More days are planned for future school holidays.
