

Items from the minutes of the November meeting (Editor's choice)

Matters Arising

Notices had been fixed to **recycling banks**, but bags of bottles are still being left beside the banks. **Land Registry.** it was agreed to register title to the Village Green at a cost of £30.00.

Local sewerage problems. Anglian Water has replied that the problems are caused by surface water drainage systems being connected to the foul sewers which would operate efficiently at all times if surface water did not discharge into them.

A **rebate on sewerage rates** is available for individual householders if it can be proved that no surface water is being discharged to the public sewers. (Application forms from 08457145145 or www.anglianwater.co.uk -details on recent bills)

Vacancy on the Parish Council

Two applications for co-option had been received and circulated by e-mail. It was unanimously agreed to co-opt **Ms Sue Peters,** with immediate effect. Thanks were expressed to Mr Dennis Bacon for his interest.

Agreement with Aldborough Lions Football Club

This had been returned signed, with a cheque for £100 to cover the nominal charge made for the use of the Green for 2007/08 and 2008/09. The Council agreed to be responsible for the provision of warning signs for the approaches to the Green.

Police Community Support Officer's Report

3 crimes reported since the last meeting - arson, assault and burglary (not of a dwelling).

Planning –All members had been consulted about an application for a single storey side extension at Amarante, Chapel Road, Thurgarton. There were no objections, so the Clerk had responded in advance of the meeting in order to meet the deadline and to be able to make comments about the sewerage/drainage problems and the out-of-date layout plan used.

There are two situations where planning contraventions may have occurred - the persons concerned to be advised of the need to obtain planning permission.

<u>Play Area Improvements</u> – NNDC is to award a contract following the successful award of lottery funding for peripatetic drop-in play/activity sessions for young people - expected to begin after the February half-term holiday.

The Youth Club has been disbanded.

<u>Footpaths</u> –There is a broken sign and reports of horses on a footpath - to be reported to NCC. <u>Health and Safety</u> –public concerns about the use of guy ropes for the Christmas Tree: councillors thought there were no reasonable alternatives.

District Council Report

The District Councils in Norfolk are all against the **proposals of the Boundary Committee.** The Parish Council indicated their support for a referendum. A **Pest Control Service** has now been reintroduced at a subsidised cost.

Revised planning application for the proposed prison at Coltishall has been submitted.

The site visit proposed as part of the Local Development Framework – Site Specific Proposals, is now likely to take place in January.

Those who wish to be allocated affordable housing in Aylsham should be on Broadland District Council's housing waiting list as well as

Grass cutting costs will be increased by 6.5% to **£781.89** plus VAT.

Noth Norfolk District Council's list.

A new four year contract for the maintenance of street lighting: the costs for the first year of £114.72 plus VAT show a 5% increase, and there will similar percentage rises each year.

NNDC have asked the Parish Council to relinquish

its delegated responsibility for street naming and numbering, with an assurance about continuing consultation and involvement - agreed.

NCC Planning and Transportation Department, suggest that there is not a significant issue with heavy goods vehicles using Dovehouse Lane.

Grants were agreed for:-

Aldborough Parochial Church Council towards the maintenance of the Churchyard - £425.00 Norfolk Accident Rescue Service - £100.00 North Walsham & District CAB - £75.00

Village Tidy-up Scheduled for 9th May2009.

Freedom of Information Act 2000 The Council decided to adopt the Model Publication Scheme without modification, with immediate effect. They also considered a draft of a list of information available under the adopted scheme and suggested various amendments. It was agreed that the scheme and list should be made available on the Village website.

<u>Financial matters</u> The Council agreed a precept for 2009/2010 of £5,000, an increase of £300.

ALDBOROUGH PRIMARY SCHOOL PRIMARY CAPITAL PROJECT

This Autumn term has seen the start of what will be a year long building project for our school, starting possibly as early as April 2009. Thus far, there has been a community consultation and a pupil consultation. The pupils have been very clear about what they like and what they don't like about the current buildings



and grounds. They have also had some very good ideas about what they would like to see! This project will see the replacement of the mobile classrooms and a refurbishment of the older parts of the school with approximately £2.3 million to be spent.

We are very much hoping that the children will learn lots about building schools during this project as well as reap the benefits of it in 2010. Already they have seen surveyors working and a drill being used to take samples of soil from the proposed building site.

The total amount raised in 2008 was £4,500. £2,100 went to The Grand Order of Water Rats: without their contribution we would not be able to hold the Annual Variety Show where all the acts give their services, or provide the Celebrity Dinner, the main raffle prizes, and support for local charities etc. £1,600 has gone to Aldborough Surgery to purchase equipment for the benefit of patients, £500 to North Norfolk Radio Families First, £300 to Motor Neurone Disease.

New Year, New Resolution

New Year's resolutions can be difficult to stick to but Norfolk Wildlife Trust has one you'll enjoy keeping all year: to spend more time in the countryside. The Trust's new wildlife calendar can help, with ideas for

places to visit and wildlife to look out for. Start in January with a trip to Holkham to experience the sight and sound of thousands of pink-footed geese feeding in the fields. In February treat yourself to the spectacle of hunting barn owls, dozens of birds of prey and common cranes roosting at Stubb Mill near NWT Hickling Broad. March's outing could be to look for hares on your nearest farmland and with luck you may even see them living up to their name of mad March hares when females box with ardent males.
