On Friday 17th, the Pope will visit Lambeth Palace, the London home of the Archbishop of Canterbury, where Anglican and Roman Catholic Bishops will come together to meet and to pray.

The visit culminates in Birmingham, with the beatification of John Henry Newman, the great Victorian churchman, whose story and journey of faith is an inspiration to many today.

News of this planned visit has drawn from certain sections of our national press, criticism, even ridicule. In a society that enjoys poking fun at authority, no doubt such criticism is sadly to be expected. I suggest that, behind the headlines, something more important and more lasting is actually taking place.

ALDBOROUGH PARISH COUNCIL

Next meeting on **Monday 6th September** at **7.30** in the Community Centre.

Items from the minutes of the August meeting (Editor's choice):

Matters arising. The manhole cover has been replaced and an account for £160.00 received.

The meeting was suspended to allow members of the public present to speak. Mr Dennis Bacon expressed his concern about the proposed cost of replacing the notice board. He also pointed out that one of the public footpaths had been affected by field spraying and that the suggested erection of a shelter on the Green was not permitted.

Police Community Support Officer's Report. Since the last meeting, there had been no crimes reported and there were six calls to the police. The next **Mobile Police Station** will be near the Post Office on **Tuesday 28th September from 11.00 - 12.00.**

Progress on Replacement of Play Areas. Norfolk County Council have decided to cut their Playbuilder 2 budget for 2010/2011 to reflect savings required by the Government, and so the expected grant of £47,000.00 will not be available. County Councillor **Diana Clarke** had received copies of correspondence from the County Council and agreed to see if there is any possibility of the grant being re-instated. In noting the situation with regret, the Parish Council asked **SP** to seek reimbursement from the County Council of the expenses she had incurred since the availability of the grant first become known. Further applications for grants will be made after the summer holidays.

Reports by Parish Councillors on their Responsibilities

BM – Planning – No objections were raised to a Planning Application for the erection of a one and a half storey rear extension at Nidlings, Hall Road, Aldborough. The Parish Council asked that the inaccuracy on the site plan be drawn to the attention of North Norfolk District Council

JH – Footpaths are wet and rather long, with many overhanging branches. "Planings" had been laid across parts of The Green near the Church Room. Those not used were being stored for future use.

ME – Health and Safety – In view of the report on the replacement of the play areas, he would now look to replace the broken chair on the swing.

JP – Allotments – All plots are let and there is a waiting list.

- * Victory Housing Trust confirm that, following an inspection prompted by the Parish Council after the condition was highlighted at the last Annual Parish Meeting, the external painting of the garages at Margaret Lilly Way is now included in the programme for this current financial year.
- * Mr Brian Monks expressed appreciation for the use of the Green for the Charles Clark Car Rally and enclosed a donation of £25.
- * The new partnership of Age Concern and Help the Aged is under the name of North Norfolk Age UK.
- * RWE Npower Renewables Limited consulted on a proposal for the Triton Knoll Offshore Wind Farm, to be sited 46 kilometres off the North Norfolk coast. The Parish Council made no comment.
- * Victory Housing Trust are seeking nominations in their search for Community Heroes in North Norfolk. No names were put forward for nomination.
- * Norfolk Constabulary have launched Police Direct, a new contact service for the public to keep in regular touch with their Safer Neighbourhood Team. Information can be received in a chosen format, ideally by e-mail. Registration can be made at www.norfolk.police.uk




