### How can you turn £5 into £6.25?

No magic involved.

Just remember to use a  
envelope if you pay tax.

Since April 2000 this facility has been available for gifts to all charities, but there has to be a 'gift trail' open to examination by the tax officials at HMRC.

#### ***How does it apply to church collections?***

For loose coins or notes put into a plate or bag, that's it - no claim can be made. But if you take the trouble to fill in the minimal information required and use a *gift aid* envelope, the church treasurer can claim **a further 25pence from HMRC for every pound given**. If you are a tax payer (income tax or capital gains tax) you don't have to do anything else; nothing further will be expected of you. If you pay tax at a higher rate, you can reclaim the extra for yourself on your own tax form.

For regular churchgoers it's simpler still – fill in a simple declaration form, available from your church treasurer, and you can be allocated a number or code which will be enough to identify your gift envelope without your having to give full details every time. If you go regularly or frequently to the other churches in the benefice the simplest way is to fill in a declaration form for each church. (Each church has its own treasurer, keeps its own accounts and has its own envelopes which are not interchangeable.)

Gifts by cheques or by banker's order, from your bank direct to the church's bank account, are obviously identifiable and very welcome, but still need the declaration of intent for *gift aid* to be claimed. Forms are available from church treasurers or *gift aid* officers.

Thank you for all the generous gifts, whether tax claimable or not.

Items from the minutes of the November meeting:

Proliferation of advertising signs on A140 NNDC to make site visit to assess what action is appropriate.

Tree opposite Alby Church NNDC Tree Officer's view was that kerbing would increase damage to the roots

Felling of horse chestnut tree – Thwaite Common NNDC Landscape Officer informed PC that felling is being investigated as possible offence under Town and Country Planning Act 1990. PC to be informed of outcome

Thwaite Common 1. Proposed earth bridge over new ditch on central section: Limited PC funds were available, but decided to postpone project until after forthcoming Management Committee meeting. In response to concerns that walkers unfamiliar with the common might fall in the ditch, it was suggested that a temporary bridge could be constructed from railway sleepers.

2. Management: Thwaite Common Management Committee meeting planned for December. Local councillor Norman Smith will be present as liaison between committee, PC and local residents.

Finance Members were unanimous that the precept should remain unchanged

a) NNDC informed PC that Planning Permission was not required for resurfacing driveway at Ramillies Barn

b) in response to local complaints about the noise from the driers in Alby Farming Company's potato store, chairman had spoken to NNDC Environmental Health who are looking into the matter

**Matters arising** Consideration of the co-option to fill Council vacancy was deferred.

**On footpaths** Norfolk County Council have now produced briefing documentation for further consideration by parish councils.

**On planning** consent had been given for replacement windows at the Old Farmhouse, Butts Common and the single storey extension at West End Farm House had been permitted.

**Grants to award to local organisations:** the Council decided to award £25 to the N Walsham CAB and £50 to the Ingworth Parochial Church Council.

**The Clerk reported** that Norfolk County Council had asked for a village contact in emergency for care of the elderly. He had been advised of a free legal service on Tuesday evenings in Cromer.

**Meeting dates for 2012:** 5th March, 14th May (including the Annual Parish Meeting), 10th September and 3rd December.

**In member's reports :** There was concern that **parking at the Priory Lane and The Street junction** can be hazardous. The Clerk would contact PCSO Spinks. It was reported that the **'track' section of School Lane towards Erpingham was rutted** and possibly dangerous to walk on. The Clerk would contact Norfolk County Council. The chairman had attended the **Aylsham Area Forum**, and encouraged members to come to the January meeting. She had also attended **the Blickling Rural Community Association** meeting. The **Council's website** would be updated in due course. **The late Valerie Belton** was remembered; she had served as member of the Council for many years. A letter from a resident about **speeding in the village** was read to the Council; the Clerk would contact PCSO Spinks.

## A SCARY STORY

An account of this terrifying event has been discovered in Carlisle Cathedral Library by a cataloguer who has sent a copy to Fr Brian. It appeared in 'THE NEWES. PUBLISHED For Satisfaction and Information OF THE PEOPLE', dated Thursday July 13. 1665. This appears to have been a government broadsheet, with local people sending information and Lost & Found adverts. This article is headed 'Norwich, July 4' and tells of a lightning strike at Erpingham Church:

"I should not trouble you with this following Relation, if I did not find it confirmed by several hands, and generally believed.

The last *Lords day*, as Mr. *Hobbs* was preaching in his Parish Church of *Erpingham* in the Afternoon, there did arise a great storme, and there descended the appearance of a great grey *Ball*, which as was supposed did beat down the *Southwest* Corner of the *Steeple*, towards the top of it; for at that Instant it fell, and carried along with it the *South Porch*: And as soon as the said *Ball* was come into the *Church*, it turned upon the *South-side*, on which were the *Mens seats* : Mr. *Hobbs* being in the *Pulpit*, saw the Men fall some one way, and some another, in such manner, that he thought they had been all struck dead. It past towards the *Chancel*, and brake; upon which the Church was as if it been all of a fire. It left a great smোক and stinck behind it, and upon the breaking, there was a great and hideous outcry in the Church, and in the conclusion there was one man found stark dead, & many others lamed, who yet continue so. One woman who sat in the *Porch*, is so weak as tis thought she will not live: It did raze and tear the Church wall in two places on the inside. One Mr. *How*, who sat above towards the *Chancel* is lame, and about the top of his thigh in the groyn, is round red place, and down from that about the breadth of a finger, a red streak to his foot, which is very painfull, and his stockin on the inside is seared, but not without."

***Are there any traces of a re-build of the south porch? Local historians have known about the lightning strike but without this detail and with conjecture about the date.***
