

Would a map of the villages be an asset? Your opinion wanted . . .

The Parish Council would like to ask the residents of Aldborough and Thurgarton for their views on a project that could, potentially, save lives.

A suggestion has been put forward by Mr and Mrs Tiffany that a map of both the villages could be put in a central location, with house names clearly marked on it. This would provide the emergency services with a valuable resource for finding the house they need as quickly as possible. It is difficult for them to find a particular house, when the houses have names, not numbers. This is made worse at night time, when names of houses are hard to see. The map would also be of use to any delivery service, or guests trying to find your house, of course.

We would like to do a trial map of the houses round The Green, and then expand it to include both villages. Siting the map is still under discussion. It would need to be illuminated so it could be seen at night. Any ideas or suggestions would be welcome. The map would NOT have people's names on it, just the names of the houses. Please would you let us know if you do NOT want your house name to be marked on the map? Please contact Ruth Elliott if you have any thoughts or questions about this idea. The **Open Gardens Day** was a resounding success, the weather was kind, the gardens beautiful, and visitors came in a steady stream – at least 300 people passed through, not counting under16s. With all bills paid, **£1500** has been raised for the Village Pond (which had been officially opened a few days earlier during the Diamond Jubilee celebrations). So many people were involved it's impossible to thank them all by name – thanks for all the time and energy, especially for muscle power in fetching and carrying, cake-baking skills, bus drivers, artists young and old - and gardeners, of course.

[A reminder to parents:- the pond is not a paddling pool and children could be at risk if they try to use it as such. The cleanliness of the water can't be guaranteed – it is for wild life after all.]

The **Festival of Marriage at Aldborough Church** was also a successful part of the O.G. Day with many people involved in setting up and clearing (thanks to everyone!) and visitors from far and wide, some who had been married there and moved away, and others who just saw that something was on. The Community Bus was invaluable in bringing people up from the village. The exhibitors showed great generosity in allowing their precious mementos to be displayed: there were dresses from three generations of the same family, fascinating and colourful Indonesian wedding garments (for men as well as for women members of the families), a photograph of Margaret Gay's wedding to the Revd Christopher Lilly in 1914, and representative fashions of bridal wear from every decade since. The Norfolk Record Office had given a photocopy of the first register from 1538, and the current register showed the most recent wedding a few weeks ago. Many thanks to all involved. RB

THE MOBILE GYM is in Aldborough Church Room every Wednesday.

Our sessions include gym, Nordic walks, Tai Chi and Zumba Fitness.

We want the local community and surrounding villages to come along to the hall and enjoy the activities that we have to offer at a very low affordable cost to everyone.

There are two fully qualified instructors who will provide you with professional tuition at all fitness levels and ensure that you have a very fun and social time when you visit us.

Our session times are as follows: **Tai Chi** 10-00-10-45; **Nordic Walking** 11-00-12-00 (this is a time change to enable people to do two sessions if they wish); **Gym** 11-00-1-30; **Zumba Fitness** 1-30-2-30

All the sessions are £2-50 per person for one session and £4-00 for two sessions, and if you are feeling really fit it's £5-00 for all the sessions and great value for money. All we ask is that when you visit us for the first time a simple medical questionnaire will need to be filled out, we will provide you with personal programmes for the gym on a regular basis.

We hope to make the gym sessions sustainable in the future so that your village and surrounding communities can exercise on a regular basis, day and evenings, so please make yourself known to Wyn if you feel that you would like to be involved in this process in any way.



OFSTED INSPECTION AT ERPINGHAM SCHOOL

Erpingham School has recently had an Ofsted Inspection – the last one was in 2008 - and we are delighted to report that we had an extremely positive visit from the inspector.

The following are excerpts from his report:-

Erpingham is a good school. Its distinctive ethos places the needs of the individual child at the centre of its work. Its excellence in **'Forest School'** work makes an outstanding contribution to pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

Achievement is good and data show that in each year group the pupils make good progress, and attainment is currently above average.

Teaching is good. The inspector came with us to visit the bluebell woods at Blickling and was impressed by the good questioning by the adults which led to creative work back at school. He loved writings such as 'lovely lush lavender colours', and 'an unbelievable umbrella of bells', and one child summing up the morning as 'bluebelltastic!' See our photograph which captures what we are about. [Editor's note: It's a pity we can't reproduce the colour.]



Pupil behaviour is good. The inspector met with parents, carers and pupils and asked for their views. One parent, speaking for many, remarked how the school was 'such a unique and special place where children are genuinely valued and supported as individuals

The school is led and managed well. One parent said 'This is an exceptional school with caring, talented staff who bring the best out of our children'.

The inspector was impressed by the way the school works innovatively and imaginatively with **'flexi-schooled' children'**. Personal recommendations, especially among families who prefer to educate their children at home part of the week has led to a rapid rise in numbers. One child who now attends full time, said 'He kept wanting to come because he enjoyed it so much'

As the Ofsted report says, 'everything we do is based on deeply held values'. We are a very small school with a big outlook and aspirations. We try to maximise every opportunity for our children to experience real and first hand learning. We provide our children with high quality outdoor education through Forest Schools which is a perfect complement to our creative curriculum.

Everybody at the school is enormously proud of our children and what we have achieved together.



SIR THOMAS ERPINGHAM RIDES AGAIN

On Tuesday, 5th June, the village of Erpingham was honoured by the presence of its famous forefather and bearer of that noble name – Sir Thomas Erpingham. Riding his faithful steed and accompanied by a humble Friar he proceeded to unveil the long-awaited village sign, a truly magnificent structure, very modern in design but with features illustrating life in Erpingham based on ideas from the children of Erpingham School.

This was the finale of a weekend of celebrations to mark the Diamond Jubilee, starting with a charity football event on Saturday afternoon followed by a barn-dance on Saturday evening. Sunday began with a Service of Thanksgiving for the Queen's 60 years' reign in Calthorpe Church, followed by The Big Lunch in the Village Hall when diners enjoyed freshly-cooked roast pork baps and shared salads and desserts provided by themselves.

Minutes of the AGM , 16th May 2012

Chairman's Report 2011-2012 was handed out to members.

Insurance Zurich quote: £420.23; Came & Company: £289.67. Zurich unable to match lower quote.

Concrete balls on verge, Thwaite Common No response from Planning & Transportation, NCC.

Fan noise, storage barns, Church Farm Environmental Health Dept. has monitored situation and didn't see a problem.

Grit bin, Aldborough School PC wrote offering to provide bin, but no reply received.

Erosion of grass verge, Aldborough School Contractors consider damage caused by parents parking rather than construction vehicles. To be discussed at next meeting.

Double white lines, A140, Alby Hall Letter from Highways Dept. read out; Mr Platts to pursue.

Footpath signs, Buck Bridge Lane No reply from Paul Ryan, NCC, and no action taken. Clerk to check whether footpath is in Colby parish, and then contact NCC again.

Bus shelter cleaning Window cleaner only washes the outside at present, but will wash the inside at an extra cost. Alternatives being considered.

Deer's Glade Caravan Site

a) During a site meeting, owners stated that they would apply to have the number of units on their licence increased to cover the new camping pods. Clerk to contact licensing officer

b) Mr Platts intends to monitor sound levels and to talk to owners when these levels are high

c) Mr Wade suggested that a different approach to the noise nuisance for residents of Alby Low Common could be to encourage the introduction of sound barriers on the caravan site, similar to those used on motorways. Mr Wade to investigate and send information to Mr. Platts.

Proliferation of signs on A140 NNDC Enforcement Officer has been off sick for many weeks and is now overwhelmed. Some signs were in breach of regulations but the matter would take time to resolve. Clerk to contact local MP to seek assistance.

Roof at Church Farm, Alby Mr Platts did not consider the white roof to be a problem as it is a small shallow section. On the other hand, Mr Wade pointed out that if the roof remained white, it would need planning permission. Clerk to talk to Toby Mermagen.

Queen's Jubilee Prices being sought for commemorative oak tree. Permission has been given to plant one near the bus shelter.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS about 'Keeping in Touch'

Q) Who pays for it?

A) The fees paid by **advertisers** for their small adverts have, over the years, paid for about ⅓ of the printing costs, and **donations** from village organisations and from individuals have covered the rest and, until recently, have allowed for a comfortable working balance. It has never aimed at profit-making. The only bill is for printing, everything else is done by volunteers.

Q) Wouldn't bigger adverts bring in more money?

A) Not necessarily – and it would mean greater costs for paper and a reduction in content for the magazine. Some parish magazines are more advert than information, and we would prefer it to stay the other way round. Advertising is strictly local – primarily 'cottage industry', not the 'big boys'.

Q) Why does the date for copy change each month? Wouldn't it be easier to have it always the 15th?

A) As it is primarily a church magazine it is timed so that it can go through letterboxes or be available in churches on the weekend of the last Sunday in the month, and Sundays aren't always the same date! Copy is asked for so that editing can be done, sent to the printers by e mail and returned by delivery van, and distribution to the volunteer deliverers accomplished in the shortest possible time. (Editing is not the same as typing - when copy comes in late it takes a disproportionate time in altered page layout, and there are often queries about dates and venues. Copy date is on the next-to-the-back page)

Q) Why are our copies sometimes late in arriving?

A) Each village organises its own delivery. **PLEASE tell me or your local organiser when this happens. Copies have ALWAYS been with the village organisers before the last Sunday.** Volunteers sometimes have holidays but should arrange for a deputy when they do. Dated material is useless after the date!

Q) We'd like to make a donation: how do we do that?

A) If you know who delivers your copy, you can give cash to pass on: or you can give cash to the Rector, preferably in an envelope with a note of the donor.
